Call to Order: Supervisor Walter Ruhl called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:30 p.m. Present were Donald Sahloff, Bernice Heidelberg, Tim Hill, Angela Christensen, and Walter Ruhl. Township Attorney Alex Drescher was present via Zoom. There were also 9 in-person guests and 8 guests via Zoom.

Dan Briskey: Walter Ruhl asked everyone to remain standing for a moment of silence for the passing of Dan Briskey who was the Township Constable for many years, a life-long member of the community, and a friend.

Appellants are requesting a zoning change for two three-acre parcels from AG - Agricultural to R-1 Rural Residential. Appellants wish to divide two three-acre parcels from the parent parcel to create buildable lots. Fire Report: Walter Ruhl reported the Ottawa Lake Fire Department tanker truck has been sent out to be refurbished.

Park Report: Walter Ruhl and Park Manager Ernie Sasse reported fill dirt improvements made around Dunmyer Pavilion and concrete will be poured this week for footers on both the Ahleman and Schnipke Pavilions. This month JAWS has donated \$4,000 worth of man hours in labor.

Road Report: Walter Ruhl and Road Advisor Bob Schnipke informed the board all township roads have been mowed.

Water Report: Walter Ruhl informed the board of the Public Hearing for Water District II, to be held July 6, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. in the township offices. The agenda for the Public Hearing is to discuss cost, district location and timeline. A resolution to define the assessment district will be read and voted on after the hearing. Letters will be sent out to the property owners that are in the proposed assessment district before the Public Hearing. This will be an in-person meeting only, and weather permitting, may be outside on the lawn. If inside, you will be asked to wear a mask if you have not had your Covid vaccine. If you cannot attend, you may submit a letter before the meeting. If you are part of the proposed district, the clerk will read your letter into the record.
