The Township office will remain closed to the public as long as the Stay At Home order is in effect. Phone messages are being checked every couple days. Emails will be checked daily. Paperwork can be dropped off in the drop box between the glass double doors into the building.

Township Board Meetings: Executive Order 2020-15 allows boards to meet electronically in order to conduct necessary business such as paying bills, payroll and approving minutes. The highlights of Executive Order 2020-15 are:

- The electronic meeting must be held in a manner that both the general public and the board may participate
- Two way communication must be available
- All persons must be permitted to participate.

A special meeting of the board was held on March 31, 2020 to approve the purchase of devices to be able to use for electronic meetings and approval to purchase the license to use one of the platforms, if necessary.
